

Fellowship Quick Guide

Milestone 1

- Proposed plan submitted to Fellowship Panel
- **Submitted 12-24 months before portfolio submission**
- Outline of proposed activities (completed and future) that will contribute to portfolio
- General feedback provided to candidate
- Connect with a mentor
- Applicant placed on active Fellowship candidate list

Milestone 2

- Draft Precis submitted to Fellowship Panel
- **Submitted minimum of 12 months prior to portfolio submission**
- Precis reviewed against current Fellowship guidelines at this timepoint
- Intensive feedback provided by Panel
- Feedback provided to the candidate within 1 month

Milestone 3

- Final portfolio submitted and application fee tendered
- Acknowledgement of submission by ASMIRT noting that Panel may seek further clarification within one week
- **Last date of submission to be awarded at next ASMIRT national conference - 1 September**

Panel assessment

- Minimum 4-6 weeks required for assessment
- **Recommendation by the Fellowship panel to the Board by 1 November**

Fellowship outcome

- **Candidate to be advised of outcome in December of that year**
- If portfolio not recommended for endorsement - candidate to receive feedback within 4-6 weeks of submission

1. A Fellow of the Australian Society of Medical Imaging and Radiation Therapy is a unique **individual** journey within a maximum seven-year period.
2. A Fellow must have been a financial voting member for the previous five years prior to submission of their Fellowship application.
3. A candidate must **demonstrate a wide breadth of knowledge and work**. Whilst the minimum points required for a successful application is 100, it is recommended that candidates submit evidence of at least 150 points.
5. Candidates must have a **mentor** to guide them through the Fellowship process.
